Erie Boulevard Hydropower, L.P. (Erie or Licensee), a Brookfield Renewable company, is submitting to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC or Commission) this Notification of Intent (NOI) and Pre-Application Document (PAD) for the relicensing of the West Canada Creek Hydroelectric Project (FERC No. 2701) (Project). The West Canada Creek Project consists of two developments, Prospect and Trenton, and is located on West Canada Creek in Oneida and Herkimer counties, New York. Erie intends to pursue a new license for the Project using the Commission's Integrated Licensing Process (ILP).

The FERC issued the current license to operate the West Canada Creek Project to Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation by Order dated March 18, 1983. The license was for a period effective March 1, 1973 and terminating February 28, 2023. On February 8, 1999 (amended April 14, 1999) Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation and Erie filed a joint application for approval of transfer of the West Canada Creek Project license. On July 26, 1999 FERC approved the transfer of license from Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation to Erie.

Erie is filing the NOI and the PAD pursuant to the requirements of 18 CFR § 5.5 and 18 CFR § 5.6, respectively, of the Commission's regulations. The enclosed NOI contains Erie's unequivocal statement of intent to file an application for a new license for the Project. The enclosed PAD describes the Project's facilities and operations, Erie's proposed process plan and schedule, and presents existing, relevant, and reasonably available information regarding the Project, its environment and any known or potential Project effects on specified resources.

In accordance with 18 CFR § 5.5(c), and as indicated in the attached distribution list, Erie is providing a copy of this NOI and PAD to all affected resource agencies, Indian tribes, and members of the public likely to be interested in this proceeding. A courtesy paper copy of the NOI and PAD was submitted to the FERC Office of Energy Projects (Room 61-02) and to the Office of General Counsel-Energy Projects (Room 101-56). Erie published a notice of the filing of this NOI and PAD in two area newspapers, the Observer-Dispatch and the Times Telegram.

In reference to 18 CFR § 5.5(e), Erie is hereby requesting designation as the non-federal representative for purposes of consultation under Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act and under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act.
